Angels Attend 67th UN Commission on the Status of Women

A select group of Angels attended the 67th Commission on the Status of Women, which was held at the United Nations from March 6-17, 2023. Caroline Dupas, Hannah Janiec, Aiko Chang, and Alexandra Valdez attended CSW67 with social studies teacher Jennifer Cucchisi and AHA Director of Mission and Ministry Joan Connelly. AHA's representatives were guests of Sister Beatriz Martinez-Garcia, SSND, director of the School Sisters of Notre Dame's UN Non-Governmental Organization Office.

Established in 1946, CSW is dedicated to promoting gender equality and the empowerment of women. CSW shapes global standards, and documents the lives of women around the world. The first CSW was held in Lake Success, New York, in 1947 (source: www.unwomen.org).

The priority theme for 2023 was innovation and technological change, and education in the digital age for achieving gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls. Various workshops allowed the group from AHA to hear about digital tools for enhancing women's political participation, Kazakhstan's efforts to accelerate gender equality, gender equality as a prerequisite for democracy, pathways to women's economic empowerment, and a cyber-safety presentation. The commission also featured a discussion of harmful practices, including child marriage and female genital mutilation.

"Our students are called to be leaders who recognize the dignity of all persons and promote justice and peace and care for all of God's creation," Connelly said. "Participating in the UN CSW supports AHA's mission because CSW supports a worldview that is based on human dignity. Attending these workshops gives the students an opportunity to examine the root causes of global injustice and work toward peace."

Cucchisi observed, "Attending sessions with diplomats and members of parliament from all over the world and seeing everything they have gone through, and are currently going through, to try to bring change in the area of gender equality is humbling, eye-opening, and inspiring. Many Holy Angels classes explore women's rights and roles around the

world. In my international studies class, we focus on the issues women face, and how change can, and urgently must, be made in achieving gender equality. Working toward equality and equity is necessary to rectify human rights violations, provide women with the tools that they need to get out of abusive situations, and empower them so they can succeed."

Hannah Janiec ('23) was impressed to witness people from all over the globe gathering to support gender equality. She was also captivated to realize she was being drawn into their discussion.

"The most memorable part of this experience was being able to sit at a conference table with more than four government officials from Australia, the Philippines, and Uganda. It was surreal having them talk directly to me and constantly make eye contact as they discussed the important efforts to eradicate the harmful effects of fake news against women on social media," she shared. "Being surrounded by hundreds of women made me feel very empowered and understood as a young female in this generation. It opened up my eyes to the many, many forms of gender-based violence and how these women, such as the Prime Minister of Uganda (Robinah Nabbanja), are striving to go against the patriarchy," Janiec said. "Hearing the stories of women who lived in desolate areas gives me the courage to ignite change in my own community regardless of obstacles that I might face because there are no human rights if women's rights are not protected."

Aiko Chang ('24) said she experienced admiration and awe in the presence of the strong, resilient female leaders at CSW67. She said she feels reassured to see these individuals working on the ongoing challenge to achieve gender equality.

"Not only was the information being shared incredibly important, but the realization that I was actually present at these forums taking



place at the UN also seemed a bit surreal," Chang reflected. "Seeing how women are finding this strength reminded me of how it is possible and that I am fully capable of that as well," Chang noted.

Caroline Dupas ('23) was impressed with the collective passion of the women who spoke at this event.

"I was inspired by the way each of them used the struggles they were presented with as an opportunity to uplift other women, yet I was also reminded of the progress remaining to be made," Dupas stated. "My participation in this event allowed me to see myself as an active part of the process of bettering the lives of women I may not even know. In seeing the range of women and laws surrounding them, I realized there are creative ways even high schoolers can make an impact. We may not be able to create laws protecting women ourselves, but we have a part in forming the norms and expectations that create an environment that either eliminates or creates obstacles for women and allows protective laws to succeed and be implemented."

Alexandra Valdez ('24) added, "I especially loved listening to a particular couple of women from different African countries because they were so filled with passion that it really inspired me to work toward the same goals in my everyday life. The way they clamored to input their thoughts at certain sessions and spoke with such hope and determination for improving women's status in the world reminded me why I

want to work at the United Nations one day, advocating for many of the same things they are advocating for right now.” Valdez plans to pursue international relations and cultural studies.

As AHA observed Awareness Day, Chang, Dupas, Janiec, and Valdez shared information from CSW67. They discussed how women face discrimination in various arenas, including online. The Angels noted how a number of women living in rural areas lack internet access and have less media literacy than women in

more developed parts of the world.

The quartet also mentioned that Kazakhstan uses digital records, including information about each individual in a family unit, to curb violence. Until recently, women in this country had been banned from 287 professions.

They shared that, worldwide, 650,000,000 girls marry before the age of 18, and 200,000,000 experience FGM.

The Angels noted that the world’s cultures must support existing laws and value women

as equal humans. Those in power must be held accountable, especially when laws are not enforced, they stressed. The Angels discussed how women must be included in the solutions to global issues, and more must become lawmakers. The presenters also noted that gender equality must be viewed through an inclusive, non-binary lens, and stated that the same solutions will not work in every country.



Renovated Auditorium Unveiled on Grandparents’ Day

On April 19, 2023, AHA held a joy-filled ribbon cutting for the completely renovated, state-of-the-art auditorium and music wing. The grand opening for the “heart of Holy Angels” took place immediately before the Grandparents’ Day/Easter Liturgy.

AHA President Melinda Hanlon and Principal Jean Miller beamed as they cut the ribbons at both sets of auditorium doors. This section of the school had not undergone any significant renovations since the building was constructed in 1965. Renovations began in June 2022, when the construction crew began carrying out the plans developed by DiCara/Rubino. From June 2022 through mid-April 2023, large events were held in the gym.

Long-awaited updates include improved acoustics, lighting, seats, curtain, stage, floor, and technology. The refreshed music wing includes a new vestry for visiting clergy and updates to the choral room and offices.

“It’s faith that brings us all here today,” President Hanlon said as she welcomed everyone to the first gathering in the new auditorium, including grandparents of members of the Class of 2023.

“If the dear Lord wants to call something into life, He also always gives the means for that to happen,” President Hanlon added, quoting Blessed Mother Theresa Gerhardinger, foundress of the School Sisters of Notre Dame.

Hanlon thanked the many people who were instrumental in bringing the project to fruition. She began with the School Sisters, AHA’s foundresses and sponsors, noting that AHA is their school. She also recognized the donors and the AHA Board of Trustees, including Chairperson Raphaela Giampiccolo and immediate past chair S. Sharon Slear, SSND, who was involved in the initial planning for the renovation project.

Hanlon acknowledged the administration, faculty, staff, and students; parent-run organizations; AHA’s advancement, finance, and maintenance staff; Campus Ministry leaders Kathy Sylvester and Maryanne Miloscia; architect Jerry Rubino; Project Manager Raymond Smith; Glenn Vanas and Stephanie Brex of Vanas Construction; consultant Theresa Shubeck; and the performing arts staff and student performers. All of those mentioned were present, along with Norberto Figueroa, Valdemar Fracz, Natalie Fariello, Tom Kohli, and Margaret Saxenian.

The President also recognized S. Mary Foley, SSND, who was liaison for the installation of the sound and light systems. S. Mary, who retired as AHA’s social worker in June 2023, is currently the director of auditorium services.

Principal Jean Miller expressed her thanks to President Hanlon for the work she invested in the successful, extensive renovation.

Bishop Michael Saporito blessed the gleaming new spaces as he presided over Mass. His homily blended news of a burgeoning mental health program led by grandmothers in Zimbabwe, the message of hope in “The Road to Emmaus,” and the way grandparents express their love.

Varsity Golfers Win First State Title, Finish Third in National Event

The AHA Varsity Golf Team is enjoying success at the local, state, and national levels.

In the spring of 2023, the team capped an exceptional season by earning their first state title. Golfers who participated in the May 16 tournament at Raritan Valley Golf Course included Amelia Shen (Class of '23); Sharanya Agarwal, Inha Jun, and Angelina Kim (all Class of '25); and Olivia Lee (Class of '26).

The Angels' score of 325 was 14 strokes better than their next closest competitor, Bergen Tech. Angelina Kim led the squad with her score of 80.

"All of the Angels in the program, past and present, are part of this victory," said AHA Varsity Golf Coach Patrick Dunne. Varsity golfers during the 2022-23 season included Faith Youn, Serin Hwang, Christine Hur, Reese Orlofsky, Alice Lee, Sidney Chung, and Emma Bang. The junior varsity squad includes Anna Donnelly, Haedyn Brigati, Regan Garrity, Eva Jurcevic, Emily Kim, and Jane Langan.

Dunne is pleased with the state championship and the team's second undefeated season (14-0 in 2022 and 2023). This is also AHA's second consecutive triple crown, an elusive honor that involves winning division, league (Big North Championship), and Bergen County titles.

Over the summer, five AHA golfers earned a third place finish in the PGA High School Golf National Invitational in Frisco Texas. In fact, Sidney Chung, Angelina Kim, Inha Jun, Olivia Lee, and Emma Bang missed second place by just one stroke.

"Our golf team represented the State of New Jersey very well," Dunne observed. "Each golfer is tremendously talented and worked together well. We are looking forward to another excellent year from AHA Golf."



Erin Ha Plays Tennis for Yale

Game, set, and match: Erin Ha. This two-time High School All American signed her letter of intent to play tennis for the Yale Bulldogs on February 17, 2023. Teammates, classmates, and Ha's parents Karen and David attended the ceremony at AHA.

Ha transferred into AHA as a junior. She posted an overall record of 72-5, which included finishing 13-2 as a junior and 25-1 as a senior. Ha has made All North Jersey, First Team All-League, and First Team All-County all four years of high school. She earned First Team All-State recognition in 2020, 2021, and 2022, and Third Team All-State in 2019. She was State Singles Finalist in 2021 and 2022, and was the 2021 USTA Girls 16 Doubles National Championship Finalist. Her achievements include becoming USTA Girls 18 Doubles Winter Nationals Finalist, USTA Girls 16 Singles National Indoor Champion, and 2022 USTA Girls 18 Doubles National Indoor Finalist.

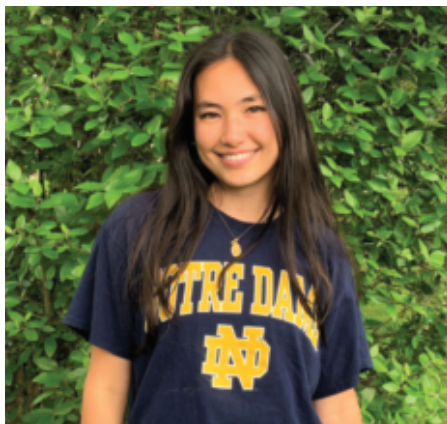
In 2021, Ha and Brooke Hess (AHA '22) individually played their way to the State Singles Semifinals, and faced each other for the right to move on to the finals. Ha emerged victorious and finished as state runner-up.

Ha also received the Dwight D. Eisenhower Leadership Award from the Parents Club of West Point.

"It has been my pleasure to serve as Erin's high school tennis coach for her junior and senior years," AHA Varsity Tennis Coach Meaghan Williams said. "Erin put her focus into each match, raising her expectations against each opponent. Erin encouraged each teammate to improve her own game."

Ha's volunteer activities include coaching younger athletes through GRIT, a program started by Chennie Kim (AHA '20).

Catherine Tuohy Receives Angel Award as AHA Honors Senior Athletes



Catherine Tuohy, a three-sport athlete, earned the Academy's prestigious Angel Award for her contributions to the spring track, volleyball, and basketball programs. As an Angel, Tuohy received eight varsity letters, and a 2023 All-League Honorable Mention for her achievements in spring track. She was captain of the volleyball team during her junior and senior years, and earned two Coach's Awards and Second Team All-League both years.

Tuohy is a member of the National Honor Society and the honor societies for Spanish, math, science, and social studies. She has served as a peer tutor, church lector, and youth coach. She is now studying at the University of Notre Dame.

"She has learned how to 'do it all' without dropping the ball on anything," said then-Athletic Director Patti Gorsuch. "Year after year, I witnessed a transformation, a maturity, and a personal growth that turned this athlete into a responsible leader, willing to tackle any task with a smile."

Gorsuch described Tuohy as that special teammate who leads by example and always stays calm, steady, and positive.

Giovanna Corbisiero received the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association's Scholar Athlete Award for her contributions to the basketball team and for posting the highest grade point average of a

senior athlete. Corbisiero graduated Second in Merit on June 2. She is studying and playing basketball at Haverford College.

Big North Student Athlete Award winners included Breanna Hetzer for soccer and bowling, Amelia Shen for golf, and Caterina Cardamone for volleyball, winter track, and spring track. Shen was a member of the first AHA Golf Team to win a state title (May 2023).

The Academy also retired the jerseys worn by Erin Ha (tennis) and Breanna Hetzer (bowling).

Hetzer is now at the University of Vermont. She was captain of the bowling team in 2022 and 2023 and earned First Team All-County honors both years. Hetzer was named First Team All North Jersey in 2023 and Second Team All North Jersey in 2022 and 2021. She was also nominated for NJ.com 2023 Bowler of the Year. In 2021, Hetzer brought home the Coach's Award and earned a second place medal in the BNC Bowling Tournament -- United Division. She earned three repeat honors in 2022 and 2023, including the Most Valuable Bowler Award, First Team All-League honors, and First Place in the BNC Bowling Tournament -- United Division. She also earned First Team All North Jersey in 2023 and First Team All-County in 2022.

Two-time High School All American Erin Ha transferred to AHA at the start of her junior year. She continued her winning ways at Holy Angels, and ultimately signed with Yale, where she is currently studying economics and playing tennis. (See related story on page 6.)

Ha also brought home the Bergen County Women Coaches Association Scholarship, and Catherine Tuohy and Federica Zazzali both earned the BCWCA Multi-Sport Award.

Zazzali, who is now a student at Villanova University, has posted several achievements in varsity cross-country. She

was named BNC First Team All-Division as a sophomore and again as a senior. During her junior year, Zazzali was named BNC Second Team All-Division and brought home the Coach's Award. As a senior, she served as team captain and earned Most Valuable Player honors. Zazzali ran varsity indoor track for the past four years. After being named Most Improved Runner during her first year with the team, she worked her way up to captain. She was also captain of the varsity outdoor track squad, where she earned BNC Second Team honors in the 1600-meter race as a junior.

Parents' Athletic Association Awards went to Federica Zazzali and tennis player Ella Oaten.

Oaten, who attends Indiana University, was captain of the AHA Tennis Team in 2022. She helped lead AHA to Bergen County Tournament titles in 2021 and 2022, and earned the 2022 Bergen County title in individual second doubles. In 2019 and 2021, Oaten qualified for the individual state tournament at first doubles. Oaten has earned the 2022 Coach's Award and numerous conference honors, including First Team All-Division, Second Team All-County in 2019, 2020, and 2021. In 2023, she was named Big North Conference First Team All-Division, and First Team All-County.

Five devoted instrumental musicians from the Academy of the Holy Angels spent May 4, 2023 performing at the 39th Annual Young Musicians Concert. The event was held at Alice Tully Hall in New York City.

Flutist Sooah Jeon ('26) and violinist Hyerin "Ella" Eom ('24) presented Hoffmeister's "Duet for Flute and Violin in G Major, Mvmt. 1." Eom also performed with violinist Hankyoung "Linda" Chang ('26), violist Faith Youn ('23), and cellist Brianna Kim ('26). This quartet presented Dvorak's "String Quartet No. 12 in F Major, Op. 96, Mvmt. 1."

AHA Orchestra Director Andrew Monticello filed applications with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, and AHA's two ensembles were subsequently selected for the Young Musicians of New Jersey Regional Concert. The Academy's instrumentalists were among the few invited to appear in New York with peers from New Jersey, New York, Connecticut, and Delaware.

"I had a great time collaborating with everyone from my chamber members to those participating from other schools and the Chamber Music Society residents," Faith Youn said of her experience. "I think it is incredible that we were among the best school-sponsored chamber groups in the tristate area, and listening to all the other groups perform was an experience in itself. During her four years as a varsity dancer, Fragola helped win Holy Angels' fifth national title in small varsity hip-hop (2021), two national silver medals in small varsity hip-hop (2020 and 2022), and state titles in pom and hip-hop (2023).



Angels Earn Metro & bergenPAC Awards

Nora Giannantonio ('24) and Eva Zazzali ('25) received a resounding endorsement for their performances in AHA's "Twelfth Night the Musical." Giannantonio received a Metropolitan High School Theater Award for Best Vocal Performance in a Female-Identifying Role, and Zazzali won the inaugural bergenPAC Executive Producer's Award.

Giannantonio, who was recognized for her portrayal of Feste, says she has been singing since before she could talk. She started studying voice at age eight, and uses songs to tell stories, paint pictures, and evoke emotions.

"I've put so many years of work into my voice, learning how to utilize dynamics and inflections to make the audience really feel something. Making people feel happy and entertaining a crowd are some of my greatest passions, and performing is a perfect way to do so."

Giannantonio has been involved in several AHA productions, and sings alto with the Academy Chorus.

"Nora's voice is something that blew us away from the first moment that she auditioned for this production," AHA Theater Director Katharine Collins said. "We knew that she was the perfect fit for the character of Feste, and we were so excited for her to show off her incredible belting range in Feste's big song, 'Is This Not Love?'"



Zazzali was recognized for her portrayal of Viola. As she prepared for her winning performance, Zazzali worked to create a character based on her own ideas.

"I could not find many other performers who had performed this role, so it was definitely a challenge, but so exciting to find ways to add different attributes to my performance!" she added. "Being able to have the opportunity to be in an environment where I can create art and form unexpected friendships has been such an incredible experience and one that I am extremely grateful for."

Zazzali has been involved in theater for about 10 years, and pursues acting, dancing, and singing lessons. She is following in the footsteps of her older sisters, Valentina ('21) and Federica ('23). When she was six, Zazzali and her older sisters appeared together in a local production of "Footloose."

"I am so grateful to be able to receive the Executive Producer's Award, although I was completely taken by surprise," Zazzali shared. "After my name was announced and I went up to make an acceptance speech...I was so happy that I got to represent the AHA Theater Program."

Arizona MAP Experience Personalizes Immigrants' Struggles

Enduring memories are the mark of each thought-provoking Mission Awareness Process trip. Just ask the travelers from AHA who spent a week at the Arizona-Mexico border in March of 2023. AHA Director of Mission & Ministry Joan Connelly and students Grace Cuttita, Jacqueline Garcia, Chloe Rodriguez, and Emma Spadora visited both sides of the international border on their quest to learn more about the immigration issue.

MAP trips are organized by AHA's foundresses and sponsors, the School Sisters of Notre Dame, and allow participants to learn how the School Sisters live their goal to promote social justice.

"We were exposed to a network of people and organizations that are trying to assist migrants and help them live with dignity," Mrs. Connelly shared. "This network provides food, shelter, legal advice, and emotional support. It gave me hope to know that there are so many folks working to heal the brokenness at the border."

Angels visited the women's sewing and gardening co-op in Agua Prieta, Mexico, which the SSNDs established as a vehicle for people to sell products and earn a living. The travelers also ate dinner with a border patrol agent who is a friend of the School Sisters. Some of the most poignant moments were speaking with families who are trying to enter the USA, witnessing a group hearing at the federal courthouse, and participating in a vigil for immigrants who have died on their journeys.

Jacqueline Garcia said she made a heartfelt connection while speaking with three female immigrants from Guatemala, where Garcia's parents were born. She saw her own father and mother reflected in these women, particularly as one woman used the same phrases Garcia has heard from her mother.

"The oldest one sort of had the same story as my father because, when she was eight, she started to work in a factory," Garcia said, explaining that her father began working on a coffee farm when he was eight years old...There was a lot that impacted me from that experience because she was telling me how she was praying to the angels for help and, when she saw my sweater with an angel on it, she started sobbing. I definitely will be getting involved more in immigration."

Garcia plans to become a doctor, and envisions herself devoting time to provide health care to immigrants.

Grace Cuttita, who took the Texas MAP trip in 2022, was ready to learn more in Arizona.

"The experiences during this trip and encounters with the migrants are raw and emotional," Cuttita said, "This trip left me with a better understanding of the journey migrants take and the struggles they face. Something I will never forget is the faces of the migrants and the stories they shared with us."

Connelly and her group also witnessed the new 30-foot high sections of the border wall (older sections are 18-feet high), which she called "a depressing sight."

"In my opinion, this wall is a human and environmental disaster," she said. "The higher and longer the wall, the more people die trying to get around it. The wall also has negatively impacted the ecosystem in the desert...This is a complex situation, but I believe we can, and must, do better to ensure the dignity of migrants."

AHA Shows Support for Haiti & Puerto Rico

Throughout the 2022-23 academic year, the AHA community joined forces to raise \$3,659 toward the School Sisters' and Beyond Borders' efforts to assist the people of Haiti. The Academy also netted \$3,057 for the Saint Bernard Project's disaster relief efforts in Puerto Rico.

These fundraisers connect with two SSND focus areas. Support for Puerto Rico addresses climate change, and the effort for Haiti aligns with sustainable development in that country. SSND focus areas also include justice for immigrants, dismantling racism, and human trafficking.

Solidarity with Haiti, an organization established by AHA alumna Janella Osbourne ('22), hosted multiple events for Haiti, including Hats for Haiti, Candy Grams for Haiti, Sno Cones for Haiti, and Hoodies for Haiti. The Student Council, French Club, Italian Club, Italian Honor Society, Green Action Team, and Asian American Cultural Society also contributed proceeds from their fundraisers to support the people of Haiti. The Thanksgiving Jeans Pass netted \$1,577 for the cause.

The Fiesta4Hope Bake Sale and Jeans Pass drew significant support for Puerto Rico, as did the Rho Kappa Pennies for Puerto Rico drive, the Art Club Bake Sale, the Kindness Klub Sweets Sale, and the Asian American Cultural Society Jeans Pass. The Puerto Rico Fundraising Committee pitched in by hosting two successful cupcake decorating sessions.



Footwear Drive Nets 400+ Pairs of Shoes for Humanitarian Respite Center



A highlight of Catholic Schools Week 2023 was the successful Sneaker & Sturdy Shoe Drive, which netted over 400 pairs of footwear for the Humanitarian Respite Center in McAllen, Texas. The drive was an outgrowth of AHA's 2022 trip to the southern border of Texas.

Breanna Hetzer, Jackie LaMastra, Raffaella Manoy, Marina Poire, Sydney Ponti, Ava Santoro, Ava Tripodi, and Grace Cuttita spearheaded the footwear drive. They were assisted by Social Studies

Department Chair Gail Fair and Kathleen Sylvester, the Texas trip chaperones.

This group of Angels was inspired to support the Humanitarian Respite Center after they volunteered there and recognized immigrants' significant need for footwear. AHA's student volunteers became frustrated with the lack of available shoes for those in need, and resolved to take action to make a difference.

Volunteers Return to Nazareth Farm

AHA volunteers recently participated in a service retreat at Nazareth Farm for the first time since the start of the pandemic. Nazareth Farm is a Catholic community in West Virginia that provides home repairs to remedy substandard housing. Alongside other volunteers, Angels used their muscle to work on the farm, build a porch, tackle roofing and siding projects, and paint a historic church.

Participating Angels included Alexa Diaz, Be'Tania Kiamue, Miranda Paquet, and Gabriella Ragucci (all '24), and Mia Diaz ('25).

AHA Campus Ministry Director Emeritus Kathleen Sylvester and AHA Campus Minister Maryanne Miloscia were chaperones.

"I love this trip because the participants have the opportunity to actually see the principles of Catholic social teaching being lived out," Sylvester said. "It reinforces what they learn at AHA."

Volunteers embrace Nazareth Farm's cornerstones of community, simplicity,



prayer, and service. They also give up social media and all electronics so they can be present for each other and those they serve. Without

these distractions, volunteers tap into their creativity and humor to keep everyone energized.

"For entertainment, my group made a parody of a song about our work day, did impressions of each other, and did a couple of contests that included the whole group," Gabriella Ragucci shared. "Personally, I was surprised by how much I enjoyed the trip and how conscious the farm was of its effects on the environment. Throughout the trip, the farm encouraged all to think and act consciously with the planet in mind."

Community Hosts Sendoff for 2023 Retirees

Several long-time members of the AHA community retired in 2023, including School Social Worker Sister Mary Foley, SSND, Athletic Director Patti Gorsuch, Main Office Manager Ellen Schiff, Facilities Manager Robert Shanney, and Campus Ministry Director Kathleen Sylvester. Together, they gave more than 100 years of service; almost half of which were logged by Shanney.

Each retiree will receive a personalized paver on the walkway near the gym. Part of the campus drive was renamed Robert Shanney Circle, and the Kelleher Hall Chapel was rededicated in honor of all of the School Sisters who have served AHA since 1879.

Shanney kept the campus safe and clean for close to 50 years. He began working at Holy Angels part time in 1973. By 1980, he was a full time employee. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from William Paterson College (now university), and holds a schools building and grounds facility manager certificate, and Integrated Pest Management Coordinator Certification. A highlight of his career was earning the Staff, Teacher, Administration Recognition Award from the Archdiocese of Newark.

S. Mary continues to serve AHA as director of auditorium services. She began her ministry as a teacher and coach in Rochester, New York, and later taught girls

in Liberia. Her career also included service as an administrator and a counselor. In 2002, she joined Holy Angels, where her ministry included work with PowerBack, a group that helps girls advocate against peer dating abuse. She and her beloved therapy dog, Luke, provided comfort to many people at AHA and beyond. S. Mary celebrated her 50th Jubilee as an SSND in 2018.

Sylvester holds a bachelor's degree from Saint Peter's University, a master's in pastoral ministry from Seton Hall, and a certificate in liturgical studies from Felician University. She began working at AHA in 2005. Sylvester is an SSND Associate, and serves on the SSND Atlantic-Midwest Province's Haiti Partnership Committee. She has invested thousands of hours organizing and chaperoning retreats, liturgies, fundraisers, Service Day, and more. She brought Bridges, a club for inclusion, to AHA.

Gorsuch received her undergraduate degree at Fordham, where she played volleyball, softball, and basketball. She went on to a 30-year career in network television broadcasting. She became the first woman to direct a network college football game, and earned numerous Emmy Awards. She retired from broadcasting, and invested the last 15 years at AHA.

Ellen Schiff joined the front office staff in 1999, and grew into her position as office manager. Schiff, who says she married her best friend, has two daughters. She enjoys traveling, music, cooking, and being with family and friends.

After her graduation from Loyola, Dowling joined the faculty at Immaculate Conception High School, where she taught English and coached track. She returned to AHA in 2014; this time as an English teacher. When the admissions director's post became available, Dowling decided to apply. Her new role fulfills a career goal she set for herself.

Salibian received a bachelor's degree in communication arts from the State University of New York College at Cortland and a master's in communication studies from Arizona State University. During her college years, Salibian participated in Abroad in Armenia, an internship that allowed her to immerse herself in local culture and assist area residents. She was also involved at the Center of Gender and Intercultural Studies in Cortland, where she promoted events and edited an online journal. Prior to joining the staff at Holy Angels, she spent five years as assistant director of admissions at Dominican University.

Scientists Impress at Columbia University's STEAMnasium

On the International Day of the Woman (March 8, 2023), over 40 AHA Middle School Angels demonstrated their scientific side at Columbia University's STEAMnasium.

AHA's visitors (who included every student from the middle school) were special guests of Dr. Jessica Riccio, a science professor at Columbia's Teachers College. Dr. Riccio spent the previous six weeks working with AHA's young members of Women in Science and Engineering.

WISE students began their after school studies with Dr. Riccio and science teacher Linda Payonzeck. Participants learned how to keep a scientific notebook, protect their work so they receive credit for their ideas and discoveries, and uncovered important scientific contributions made by women. The WISE curriculum also allowed students to try astronaut/science teacher Christa McAuliffe's lost lessons. McAuliffe, who perished in the 1986 Challenger accident before she could share her lesson plans, inspired Dr. Riccio to become a teacher.

"At the Academy of Holy Angels Middle School, we are richly blessed with opportunities to expand our learning experiences beyond the concrete walls of our classrooms," said Traci Koval, dean of AHA Middle School. "This is just the beginning of many exciting things to come!"

During their day at Teachers College, WISE students presented their inventions, research on female scientists, explorations of scientific phenomena, and animal habitats. One student tested changes in color when different liquids are combined. Another worked out a magnetic system that dispenses dog food. Other Angels researched COVID, how parachutes function, and glacial erratics.

STEAMnasium activities included a chance to operate a robot and learn about drones. Visitors learned how indigenous peoples used the sun to mark time, interacted with an artificial intelligence chatbot, and took a Dinosaur Dream Expedition that featured augmented and virtual reality.

Plans for 2023-34 include two separate WISE programs; one in the fall and one in the spring, to allow for smaller groups and more personalized instruction. WISE veterans who now attend the upper school will be asked to return as mentors.





'Angelic Evening,' AHA's Signature Celebration, Turns 25

Angelic Evening, the Academy's signature celebration, just turned 25. The Holy Angels community marked the occasion at the Edgewood Country Club with an evening of dinner, dancing, awards, prizes, and silver decorations.

Since the event's inception, Angelic Evening has involved many months of planning and coordination. It's not surprising that an able alumna, AHA Assistant Director of Advancement – Events Barbara Burklund ('77) has been the driving force behind Angelic Evening since 2013.

Over time, more aspects of this celebration have become facilitated by technology. Another significant change is the move to an off-campus venue. When Angelic Evening was launched, the celebration was held on the Demarest campus, where volunteers invested hours transforming the gym into a chic spot for dining and dancing.

We have 8 of our 10 family Angels here tonight."

Wacker is the new president of the AHA Alumnae Association. She studied finance and organizational management at Nyack College, and later became an accounting manager, accounting analyst, procurement analyst, and award-winning Realtor. Since 2015, Wacker has served on various AHA committees. Wacker, an AHA Dance Team parent, was also the dance team/spirit wear coordinator. She also invested many years as a volunteer with the Saint Joseph School Parent Teacher Organization.

The Mario & Theresa Spola Family Foundation received the Legacy Award in honor of the organization's contributions that reflect the charism of the School Sisters of Notre Dame and make a lasting impact on the Academy and the people it serves. Theresa Spola Doyle '69 accepted the award on behalf of the foundation.

Holy Angels observed Feast Day 2023 at an October 2nd Mass. This year marks the 144th anniversary of Sister Mary Nonna Dunphy's signing of the deed for the Academy's original campus in Fort Lee. Dunphy, a School Sister of Notre Dame, executed the document on the Feast of the Holy Guardian Angels, and the Academy took its name from the holiday.

AHA President Melinda Hanlon welcomed the assembly and announced that, after Mass, the chapel in Kelleher Hall would be renamed The Chapel of the Angels in honor of all of the School Sisters who have served AHA for the past 144 years. President Hanlon highlighted their courage, hard work, and achievements, noting that the way AHA moves forward is one form of honoring Holy Angels' foundresses and sponsors. AHA's past-president S. Patricia Murphy, SSND; and Director of Auditorium Services S. Mary Foley, SSND, were in attendance at Mass.

During the Liturgy, celebrant Father Kevin Kilgore of Saint Pius X Church in Old Tappan commissioned 11 Angels as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. AHA's newest Eucharistic Ministers include Attiana Badolati, Sofia Cardoso, Keira Corcoran, Grace Cuttita, Caitlin Deiser, Kristina Migliaccio, Ashley Miskovitz, Ava Tripodi, Olivia Papp, Marine Poire, and Rylie Smith.

After Mass, Fr. Kilgore, S. Mary, the Eucharistic Ministers and their families, and members of the administration gathered in Kelleher Hall for the rededication of the chapel. President Hanlon noted that the chapel was being blessed and renamed in honor of the 190th anniversary of the establishment of the School Sisters, and in honor of the service of the SSNDs to AHA in particular.

"To this day, they sustain us," she noted. Hanlon pointed out the stained glass windows, which depict Blessed Mother Theresa Gerhardinger, who founded the SSNDs in Bavaria; and Mother Caroline Friess, who led the group of SSNDs who worked in the United States.



Celebrating the 190th Anniversary of the SSNDs

The Holy Angels community marked the 190th anniversary of the establishment of the School Sisters of Notre Dame on Foundation Day (October 24, 2023). Angels in Grades 6-12, faculty, staff, and several School Sisters attended the morning prayer service.

Participating SSNDs were S. Kathleen Dunham, an educator and administrator who retired from AHA in 2020; S. Mary Foley, AHA's retired social worker and current director of auditorium services; S. Josefina Morales, a psychotherapist; and S. Rebecca Tayag, who is marking her 50th Jubilee. SSND Associate Kathleen Sylvester, the retired director of Campus Ministry, was also present.

Caroline Gerhardinger (later Blessed Mother Theresa of Jesus) and two other women took their vows in Bavaria in 1833. Many convent schools were being closed due to political and religious sentiments that resulted from the French Revolution and Enlightenment. Mother Theresa, who had attended a school that was closed, made it her mission to provide others with a proper education. When she died in 1879, there were more than 2,500 SSNDs educating girls.

S. Mary Foley's reflection was a reminder that the School Sisters remain at work throughout the world. S. Mary, who taught in West Africa, spoke about her visit to the SSNDs working in Chile, and S. Paulina of Micronesia, who now teaches in Guam.





Holy Angels Honors 143rd Graduating Class

The Most Reverend Michael Saporito presided. Faith Youn ('23) played the violin solo during the singing of "Shalom."

AHA President Melinda Hanlon noted that the 122 graduates amassed \$11.3 million in scholarships, and provided 44,702 service hours locally, nationally, and internationally.

Caroline Dupas graduated First in Merit and was named commencement speaker, AHA's highest honor. Dupas is a Mother Caroline Scholar, National Merit Commended Student, and an Advanced Placement Scholar with Honors. As a member and president of AHA Model United Nations, Dupas was a five-time Best Delegate winner. She participated in an online climate change/human rights program with the U.S. Embassy in Iraq, and represented AHA at the United Nations' 67th Commission on Status of Women. She was an Angel Ambassador and co-president of the AHA Social Advocacy Youth Group, where she fundraised for Ukraine. She now attends Georgetown.

"Be your story's own main character," Dupas told her peers, noting that many answers to life's questions already lie within. "Bring others up with you while you fly to success."

Giovanna Corbisiero graduated Second in Merit. Corbisiero, who was captain of the basketball team, received the NJ State Interscholastic Athletic Association's Scholar Athlete Award. She earned First Team All-Division, All-County, and the Coach's Award for basketball and First Team All-League honors for the 400-meter

relay. Her volunteer activities include teaching basketball to younger students. Corbisiero earned AHA's Mother Caroline and Nonna Dunphy scholarships. She participated in the Englewood Hospital Surgical Science Research Program, and studied genetics at the UPenn Summer Prep program. Shivani Sahu's peers asked her to deliver the senior response. "Angels now. Angels always," Failla began, immediately capturing her audience.

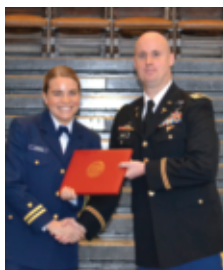

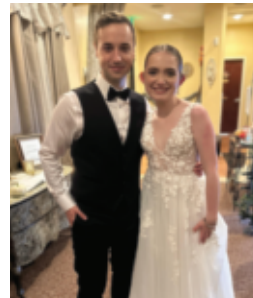
